Day 1: Arrival in Delhi & Transfer to Barkot

On the way to Barkot enjoy a scenic drive through the picturesque landscape of Uttrakhand. You will be thrilled to see the beautiful views of Shivalik ranges and the river Yamuna.



Day 2: Barkot to Yamunotri and Return

Next day begin your day early for Janki Chatti which is base point for Yamunotri trek and enjoy 6 Km trek to Yamunotri temple which is dedicated to Goddess Yamuna. After taking dip in the sacred Surya Kund head back to Barkot.



Day 3: Barkot to Uttarkashi

Embark on drive to Uttarkashi and visit Vishwanath Temple which is an ancient temple dedicated to Lord Shiva .



Day 4: Uttarkashi to Gangotri and Return

Next day visit Gangotri Temple which is dedicated to Goddess Ganda and explore nearby sites like Bhairath Shila and Pandava Gufa in Gangotri.



Day 5: Uttarkashi to Guptkashi

Proceed to Guptkashi and visit Ardhnarishwar Temple dedicated to Lord Shiva and Parvati and enjoy drive along the Mandakini River.

Day 6: Guptkashi to Kedarnath

Early morning drive to Sonprayag and begin your 18 Km trek to Kedarnath and enjoy arti dedicated to Lord Shiva.



Day 7: Kedarnath to Guptkashi

After attending the morning rituals at Kedarnath Temple descend back to Sonprayag.



Day 8: Guptkashi to Badrinath

Next day begin your journey to Badrinath Temple which is one of the four Char Dham dedicated to Lord Vishnu and participate in evening arti. Explore Mana Village in Uttrakhand which is last village before Indi Tibetan border known for its mythological significance.



Day 9: Badrinath to Rishikesh/Haridwar

After attending morning rituals at Badrinath temple begin journe towards Rishikesh/Haridwar and visit Ram Jhula and Laxman Jhula which is iconic suspension bridges with stunning views of the Ganges and enjoy Ganga Arti at Har ki Pauri.



Day 10: Rishikesh/Haridwar to Delhi

Post breakfast begin your journey back to Delhi.
